Subject:- Grant of 2nd Renewal of Permission to Rajiv Gandhi Education Society's Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital Taluka Ron, Dist. Gadag-582209, Karnataka (AYU0085), with intake capacity of 85 seats (instead of 100 seats) in UG (BAMS) course and Extended Permission in 06 PG courses with 36 seats in subjects namely i) Kayachikitsa-06 seats, ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-06 seats, iii) Shalya Tantra-06 seats, iv) Rachna Sharir- 06 seats, v) Panchakarma- 06 seats, vi) Prasuti & Stree Roga-06 seats, for the academic session 2026-27 under section 29/28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Rajiv Gandhi Education Society's Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital Taluka Ron, Dist. Gadag-582209, Karnataka (AYU0085)** inspection was conducted on **16.07.2026 and 17.07.2026 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the **Permission with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 06 PG courses with 36 seats in subjects namely i) Kayachikitsa-06 seats, ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-06 seats, iii) Shalya Tantra-06 seats, iv) Rachna Sharir- 06 seats, v) Panchakarma- 06 seats, vi) Prasuti & Stree Roga-06 seats, for the academic session 2026-27 under section 28/29 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
- 2) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the "Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024" and "Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda Regulation, 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations thereunder. **On careful examination of the assessment report, visitor observation and approved punitive policy, it is found that your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria, due to various shortcomings.**
- 3) In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the **167th Board Meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on **30.07.2026**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above, **the Board discussed and decided to provide an opportunity of virtual hearing** vide the MARB-ISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even number** dated **31.07.2026** to appear before the designated Hearing Committee on **04.08.2026**, to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the Permission to your college with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 06 PG courses with 36 seats in subjects namely i) Kayachikitsa-06 seats, ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-06 seats, iii) Shalya Tantra-06 seats, iv) Rachna Sharir- 06 seats, v) Panchakarma- 06 seats, vi) Prasuti & Stree Roga-06 seats be reassessed as per Punitive policy.**
- 4) The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide letter no.- RGES/AMC&H/MARBISM/253/2026-27 dated 01.08.2026** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. I B Kotturshetti, Principal** of College appeared before the hearing committee on 04.08.2026 and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college.
- 5) **Thereafter, the observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing was duly placed in the 171st Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 14.08.2026 and Board concluded**

that the college is fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of extended permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulation.

- 6) Hence, the Board decided to issue Permission in UG and in 06 PG in accordance with Regulation 64 (2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 and Regulation 15(5) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions) and (Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations 2024, under section 29/28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2026-27.

❖ As per the "Punitive Policy for the academic session 2026-27"

- i) "For each deficient teaching faculty, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 05% of total intake capacity."

As per the observation there is shortcoming of 01 higher faculty each in department namely Kriya Sharir, Swasthviritta & Yoga and 01 lower faculty in Kaumarbhritya- Bala Roga respectively.

There is deficiency of total 03 teaching faculty, therefore seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 15% of total intake capacity (i.e. Reduction of 15 seats).

Accordingly, after applying the seat reduction policy 2026-27 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of 2nd Renewal of Permission with seat reduction with intake capacity of 85 seats (instead of 100 seats) in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and Extended Permission in 06 PG courses with 36 seats in subjects namely i) Kayachikitsa-06 seats, ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-06 seats, iii) Shalya Tantra-06 seats, iv) Rachna Sharir- 06 seats, v) Panchakarma- 06 seats, vi) Prasuti & Stree Roga-06 seats, for the academic session 2026-27 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.

"DECISION"

- 7) **Rajiv Gandhi Education Society's Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital Taluka Ron, Dist. Gadag-582209, Karnataka (AYU0085) is hereby granted with:-**
- 2nd Renewal of Permission with seat reduction with intake capacity of 85 seats (instead of 100 seats) in UG (BAMS) for the academic session 2026-27 in accordance with Regulation 64 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and
 - Extended Permission with intake capacity of 36 Seats in 06 PG course in subject namely i) Kayachikitsa-06 seats, ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana-06 seats, iii) Shalya Tantra-06 seats, iv) Rachna Sharir- 06 seats, v) Panchakarma- 06 seats, vi) Prasuti & Stree Roga-06 seats, for the academic session 2026-27 in accordance with Regulation 15(5) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulation, 2024 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the following conditions:-
- I. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of with 85 seats (instead of 100 seats) and minimum 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 36 Seats in 06 PG course shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2026-27 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
- 8) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 9) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 10) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

- 11) Compliance report of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the implementation letters vide ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS dated 09.05.2024 and 06.09.2024 issued by the board.
- 12) The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2026 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2027-28 :-
- All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.
 - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
- 13) The fulfilment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
- 14) Further, in case you are not satisfied with the decision of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM, you may prefer an appeal addressed to the Chairman, NCISM, within 15 days of issuance of the decision of the Board as per regulation 65 of MESAR 2024 and section 29(5) of NCISM Act 2020.

Note:- It is also noted that, if the concerned University does not grant affiliation to the college or withdraws the affiliation, the permission granted by MARBISM shall automatically stand withdrawn without any further notice or order.
